## CODE OF CONDUCT & COLLEGE REGULATIONS

- Students joining the college are bound by the Rules and Regulations of the college.
- Every student must wear the I.D. Card before they enter the college.

- 4. Attendance: As per the Maharashtra Public Universities Act 2016 and Statute 0.6086 and also as per the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education, Pune all bonafide students MUST attend a minimum of 75% of the lectures, tutorials & the practicals conducted in each semester as per the time table to be eligible to appear in the Semester - End Examination.
- In case of illness, a student must apply for leave, as soon as possible, with a doctor's certificate.
- Smoking & Alcohol is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- Students shall do nothing either inside or outside the College that will in any way interfere with its orderly conduct and discipline.
- No student shall collect any money or contribution for picnic, trip, educational visit to some place, get together, study-notes, charity or any other activity without prior sanction of the Principal. No student will be allowed to take an active part in current politics.
- 9. No student shall communicate any information or write about matters dealing with the College in any manner to the Press or Media. Students are expected to take proper care of college property and to help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Causing damage to the property of the College e.g. disfiguring walls, doors, fittings, or breaking furniture, etc., is a breach of discipline and the guilty will be duly punished with the required fine.
- Students are expected to be responsible for their own belongings. The College will not be responsible for the lost property.
- Students applying for certificates, testimonials, etc. must apply through the student's support page on the college website and then follow-up with the college office.
- 12. If, for any reason, the continuance of a student in the College, is, in the opinion of the Principal, detrimental to the best interest of the College, the Principal may ask such a student to leave the College without assigning any reason for his/her expulsion.
- Insubordination and inappropriate language or misconduct on the part of a student may lead to his/her suspension or dismissal from the college.

- 14. Students receiving Government or College Scholarships or any remission in fees, must note that the grant and continuance thereof are subject to good behavior, regular attendance and satisfactory progress and good results at College and Board or University Examinations.
- 15. All College activities must be organized under the guidance and supervision of the Principal and Professor In-Charge with prior permission.
- 16. Students must not associate themselves with any activity not authorized by the College Principal. Serious view will be taken of students found organizing or participating in such unauthorized activities.
- 17. It is the responsibility of the student to read the notice boards regularly for important announcements made by the College authorities from time to time. They will not be excused or be given any concession on grounds of ignorance.
- 18. Students are prohibited to use college name to any private or individual event. Violation may lead to permanently debarring such students from the college.
- 19. Matters not covered under the existing rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal.
- 20. The college shall take action in accordance with the Anti-Ragging Regulations imposed by the Maharashtra Prohibition Ragging Act, 1999 against those found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, actively or passively, or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging.
- 21. The Admission can be confirmed only when all physical documents are verified.

The application for admission, enrolment or registration must be accompanied by an Anti-Ragging affidavit signed by a student in a prescribed format and another Anti Ragging Affidavit signed by a Parent/Guardian. ## GENERAL INFORMATION



### 1) DOCUMENTS ISSUED BY THE COLLEGE

#### IDENTITY CARD

The Identity Card is an important document. Every student is required to take a good care of it and must always carry it with oneself. Students are required to show it on demand in the College, in the Library, at any college event and while travelling on local trains. The loss of Identity Card should be immediately reported to the College Office in writing, with a statement of the circumstances in which it was lost. The office will issue a Duplicate Identity Card against payment of Rs. 100/-. At the University Examination Centres all candidates are required to produce, their identity cards along with their hall tickets.

#### RAILWAY CONCESSION

All students are eligible for concession on railways for local journeys between the stations nearest to their residence and the College. Students are also eligible for concession on railways for journeys between their place of permanent residence and Mumbai during vacation only. Students are requested to enter their local and permanent addresses correctly in the Admission Forms to facilitate issue of such Railway concession orders. The place of permanent residence, in the application for admission means the place where the student and/or their parents normally reside. This address will not be allowed to be changed during the academic year. The railway concession counter is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on all working days (excluding lunch hours).

#### TRANSCRIPTS

Students desirous of pursuing further studies abroad should apply for transcripts along with payment of necessary fees at the office counter well in advance. After verification of marksheets and other relevant papers the college will hand over the Transcripts / Letter of Recommendation in ten days' time. The Transcripts counter is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on all working days (excluding lunch hours).

#### DUPLICATE COPIES OF DOCUMENTS

Students who intend to apply for duplicate copies of their statement of marks, certificates of passing, degree certificates as well as special certificates, should produce an affidavit on a non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.100/- made in that behalf before the metropolitan magistrate or notary appointed by the government to that effect, the reason for the issue of duplicate copy of the aforesaid documents mentioning therein so also, the First Information Report (FIR) registered in the police station for the reasons whatsoever, i.e., loss, damage of the same, etc., to check the misuse of the aforesaid documents. On completion of these formalities and payment of necessary fees the required duplicate certificates will be issued to the concerned students accordingly.

#### 2) HOLIDAYS

The College will remain closed on Sundays and all Public Holidays as declared by the Maharashtra Government, Maharashtra State Secondary and Higher Secondary Board, University of Mumbai and on such other days as the Principal may declare from time to time as per prescribed rules.



The minimum requirements for admission to Bachelor of Science (Information Technology) are regulated by Ordinance No.: 0.5051 and Circular No.: No.UG/283 of 2007, Dated 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2007 as issued by the University of Mumbai:

- a. A candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course of Bachelor of Science-Information Technology, should have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary or it's equivalent with Mathematic and Statistics as one of the subject in the first attempt.
- b. Candidate who have passed Diploma (Three years after S.S.C. X<sup>th</sup> Std.) in Information Technology/Computer Technology/ Computer Engineering/Computer Science/Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches/Mechanical and Allied Branches/Civil and Allied branches are eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course.

However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body.

#### OR

Candidates with post HSC-Diploma in Information Technology/Computer Technology/ Computer Engineering/ Computer Science/ and Allied branches will be eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of B.Sc. (I.T.).

## Choice Based Credit System (C.B.C.S.) for S.Y's & T.Y's

- c. Alearner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester IV irrespective of number of courses of failure in semester III.
- d. Alearner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester V if he/she passes Semester I, Semester II, Semester III and Semester IV

#### OR

A learner shall pass Semester I and Semester II and fails in not more than FOUR courses of Semester III and Semester IV taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester III & Semester IV.

- The result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester IV and Semester V in full.
